Enrollment Information

School Day: The school day starts at 7:40am and ends at 2:50pm. Students attend seven 47-minute class periods, with an 8th period called seminar, for 25 minutes each day. Seminar is dedicated to study hall days, club meetings, pep assemblies, and more. Lunch is broken up into three 30 minute groups based on the student's 5th hour teacher.

Required Courses

Four Core Classes All students will take four core classes in the areas of language arts (ELA), math, science, and history. These courses are all year-long courses.

Digital Basics Digital Basics is required one-semester for all 6th grade students. The course will explore computer skills and different Microsoft and Google programs. This course will also take students through the Digital Citizenship program.

Physical Education All 6th grade students will be required to take part in a one-semester PE course while 7th and 8th grade students may take it as an elective.

Elective Courses

Electives Students will have the option to take elective courses after enrolling in core courses. 6th graders will have one period available each semester and 7th and 8th grade students will have two periods each semester to choose elective classes.

Band/Vocal Music 6th grade students may only take Band *or* Vocal Music, 7th and 8th graders may choose to take both. Band and Vocal Music are full year electives and will not change at semester.

Grade 6 Courses

6602

6th ELA 6200/6201

Language Arts (grade 6) courses build upon students' prior knowledge of grammar, vocabulary, word usage, and the mechanics of writing. This includes the four aspects of language use: reading, writing, speaking, and listening. These courses may emphasize the use of language for different effects, in different contexts, and for different purposes.

64h Math 6300/6301

Mathematics (grade 6) courses typically emphasize skills in numerical operations (including basic operations and their proper order); measurement; patterns; simple functions; geometry; and concepts of data analysis, including statistics and probability.

6th Science 6400/6401

Science (grade 6) courses typically include subject matter from several strands of science, including earth/space sciences, physical sciences, and life or environmental sciences and may organize material around thematic units.

6500/6501 6500/6501

Social Studies (grade 6) courses provide a greater understanding of social studies disciplines, including history, geography, civics and government, and economics. These courses often focus on the history, culture, and government of various specific world societies. Typically, students develop skills used in the social studies disciplines.

6600 6600

Students will participate in a variety of team sports, individual sports, and officiating units. Students will study advantages of living a healthy lifestyle and the importance of implementing healthy habits. Topics in Health include self-esteem, nutrition, fitness, eating disorders, drugs and alcohol, decision making, stress, and more.

Digital Basics & Literacy

This class will introduce students to technology proficiencies as they prepare for success in the 21st century. Students acquire knowledge and master skills outlined by the International Society for Technology in Education. The online quests include, but are not limited to: digital citizenship, digital images, career prep, cyber safety, screen casting, trouble shooting, and many more.

Grade 6 Elective Courses

6th Band 6640/6641

<u>Prerequisite:</u> Knowledge of brass, wind, or percussion instrument. The purpose of band is to teach comprehensive musicianship (musical style, technique, small ensemble skills, sight reading, etc) through performance. Attendance at all concerts and one contest is required.

6th Vocal Music 6630/6631

This class includes an emphasis on choral technique, developing an appreciation for music through listening and participation, and the study of elements of music. This group will participate in concerts and contests. Attendance at programs/concerts and specified concert dress are required.

6th Intro to Industrial Tech 6622

In this class students will learn about Technology Student Association (TSA) and the opportunities of competition the organization provides. Students will design, sketch, and build projects such as nameplates, clothespins, creatures, and notepad holders.

6th Spanish 6620

This exploratory class will focus on culture and beginning level Spanish expressions. Concepts such as the alphabet, calendar, cognates, classroom and school subjects, numbers, colors, greetings, and a basic understanding of Spanish-speaking cultures will be taught.

6th STEM 6609

STEM courses provide an overview of the practical uses of a variety of engineering applications. Topics covered usually include hydraulics, design and modeling, automation and robotics, energy and the environment, pneumatics, and various computer related technology related to product design.

6th Art 6607

Art (grade 6) courses provide to students activities that foster creative expression, communication through artistic endeavor, and appreciation of culture and heritage. Activities may include those that enable students to refine their technique, increase their artistic vocabulary, express themselves and their world view, make connections to other content areas, develop their own aesthetic, and strengthen their critical abilities.

6th FACS 6606

This class is a general elective course to introduce students to career and life literacy skills in all areas of Family and Consumer Sciences. Students will receive instruction in career exploration, nutrition and food preparation, family life, interpersonal relationships, housing and interior design, sewing production, and career related tasks.
